



Alesund became a town in 1848. Then there lived 1200 people here. Today here is about 44.000 inhabitants and the town is located on the northwest coast.

Aalesund is the largest fish harbour and the forth largest export harbour in Norway.

There are 2 special mountains in the center, Sukkertoppen (314 mos) and Aksla (189 mos), both with fantastic view.

The town arms shows a local fishing boat which symbols the economic basis for the town.

Aalesund is one of 17 small communities that makes the region Sunnmøre. There are many islands in the western area and narrow fiords in the eastern part. Together here lives 135.000 people.

Det er 2 særmerka fjelltopper i sentrum, Sukkertoppen (314 moh) og Aksla (189 moh), begge med fantastisk utsikt.

Ålesund er en av 17 kommuner på Sunnmøre. Det er mange øyer i vest og trange fjorder i øst. Til sammen bor her vel 135.000 mennesker.
