

Cherbourg shawl



You will need:

3.5 mm circular knitting needle.
650-700 meters of lace yarn.

Cherbourg shawl

SET UP ROWS:

Cast on 5 stiches and knit.


Next row: k1, kfb (knit front and back of stitch), k1, kfb,k1.

Begin CHART A.

Repeat rows 17 to 22 of Chart A 21 more.(Or many times as you want to, but end with the Row 22 sequence.)

Only the left part of the shawl is represented, the right part must be knitted in mirror.
This nice stich has been created by Judy Marples for her Calais Shawl.

Legend: 6-stitch repeat

center stitch: knit RS and purl WS

knit: (garter stitch)

knit RS and purl WS

yo: yarn over

purl

s2,k1,p2sso: slip first and second stich together as if to knit, knit 1 stitch, pass 2 slipped stiches over the knit stitch.


Begin CHART B. Like the shawl itself, ruffle can be as deep as you want it to be.

End with a stretchy bind-off.

Weave in ends and wash.

Cherbourg Shawl doesn't really need to be blocked, because of the ruffle.
