

THE LONDON GATE HASTA EL PUENTE DEL ALAMILLO

Tower Bridge: one of London's gates

This bascule and suspension bridge was built from 1886 to 1894. It crosses River Thames in London. The two towers are tied together with high air walkways.

It is located close to the Tower of London and is an iconic symbol of London.

It was officially opened on 30th of June 1894 by the Prince of Wales and his wife.
