This review will talk about the movie "Total Recall" that released the 15th of August 2012 in France. Firstly I'm gonna talk a little about the director and actors of the film, secondly I'll try to do a brief recap of the history and finally I'll give my opinion about the film.

Total Recall is a very old films of science fiction that has first been released in 1990 by Paul Verhoeven with, amongst other things, Arnold Schwarzenegger, Sharon Stone, ...

The Total Recall that has been released in 2012 and directed by Len Wiseman is a "remix" of the old one with new technologies of special effects and important changes on the script like the fact that the action take place on Earth and not on Mars for example.

The story of the film take place in the future, in 2048, when Earth has been devastated by nuclear war and separated in 2 parts : one part with bureaucrat and rich people in Europe and the other one with workers and poor in Australia.
