...Saint Patrick's Day

On March 17, Irish people all over the world celebrate Saint Patrick's Day.

The person who was to become St. Patrick, the patron saint of Ireland, was born in Wales about 385 after Jesus Christ's birth.

Far from being a saint, until he was 16, he considered himself a pagan. At that age, he was sold into slavery and during his captivity he became closer to God. He escaped from slavery after six years and went to Gaul, where he studied in a monastery for a period of twelve years. During his training, he became aware that his calling was to convert the pagans to Christianity.

His wishes were to return to Ireland, to convert the native pagans to Christianity and finally he became quite successful at winning converts.

Patrick was arrested several times, but escaped each time. He traveled throughout Ireland, establishing monasteries across the country. He also set up schools and churches which would aid him in his conversion of the Irish country to Christianity. His mission in Ireland lasted for thirty years.

Though originally a Catholic holy day, St. Patrick's Day has evolved into more of a secular holiday. One traditional icon of the day is the shamrock and the custom consists in wearing a shamrock on his feast day. The St. Patrick's Day custom came to America in 1737.
