The 120 ECTS IMQP curriculum aims to provide competitive fundamental and applied training in Prehistory, Paleoanthropology, Quaternary Geology, Palaeobiology, and in Prehistoric Heritage conservation and management. Students who are awarded the joint degree signed by the partners' institutions (UNIFE, URV, MNHN, IPT, UTAD) or the multiple degree with UPD are able to undertake further research (e.g. PhD) or to directly enter a professional career in relation to Prehistoric Archaeology and Heritage.

Scholarships

For the academic year 2011-2012 the IMQP offers 19 scholarships financed by the European commission:

- ◇ - **7 scholarship for non european students** (~ 32.000 € for two years)
- ◇ - **4 scholarship for european students** (~ 17.000 € for two years with mobility in the Philippines)
- ◇ - **scholarship for non europeans professors** (~ 1.200 € a week)
- ◇ - **scholarship for europeans professors** (~ 1.200 € a week)

Tuition fees: 1.000 € /year

Students mobility track:

The student's mobility accounts to at least 30% of the entire curriculum. The extensive collaborative experience of the members of the consortium is of valuable help to optimize the mobility program. Mobility is supported by the provision of various facilities, e.g. subsidized accommodation, language courses, cultural immersion initiatives, etc.

Student mobility among the IMQP partner institutions is organized on a personal basis by mutual agreement between the student and the IMQP Master Program Board. It promotes a high level general training in Quaternary and Prehistory and offers the opportunity to benefit from the various clusters of excellence developed by each participating institution following the student's intended specialization. It considers, furthermore, the need to develop major interactions and integrative actions among students and teachers originating from various European and non-European countries.

The duration of a mobility track will be up to one year and may include the participation in specific activities such as summer field schools, excavations and heritage research and development initiatives.

Teachers' mobility is also regularly carried out within the IMQP consortium in order to share competencies and areas of expertise.

At the end of the curriculum, and before being awarded the IMQP Joint Degree, the student must defend her/his own master's thesis before an international commission composed of teaching-staff members of the Consortium.
