Laws that protect young workers in the UK

Teenagers can have part-time jobs only if they are aged over 14 – with an exception for children working on the family farm. There are strict regulations to protect young teens.

- Young workers can work only after 7 a.m. and before 7 p.m.
- On school days, teens can work a maximum of two hours.
- During school holidays, teens can work a maximum of 35 hours a week.
- Outside school holidays, teens can work a maximum of 12 hours a week.
- Teenagers over 16 can work eight hours on Saturdays.
- 16 and 17-year-olds get paid £3.68 per hour;
 18 to 20-year-olds get paid £4.98.
- Jobs teenagers can do: paperboy (or girl), milkman, babysitting, washing cars (not in a garage); working in a shop, at a hairdresser's, in a café, in a restaurant or hotel, in agriculture.
