When reporting statements to indirect speech, some changes cmcerning punctuation, pronouns, verb tenses and time expressions are necessary.

Verb Tense Changes	2

Present Continous	⇔	<u>Past Continous</u>

Simple Past	⇔	Past Perfect
"Bill arrived last Saturday," he	e told us	He told us that Bill had arrived the previous Saturday.
<u>Present Perfect</u>	⇔	<u>Past Perfect</u>
"I had just turned out the light," he said. He explained that he had just turned out the light.		
<u>Present Perfect Con</u>	<u>tinous</u> ⇔	Past Perfect Continous
They said 'We have been waiting for hours". They complained that they had been waiting for hours.		
Past Continous	₽	Past Perfect Continous
"We were living in Paris", they	told her.	They told her that the had been living in Paris.
<u>Simple Future</u>	₽	Present Conditional
"I will be in Geneva on Monday", he said He said that he would be in Geneva on Monday.		
Future Continous	₽	Conditional Continous
She said," I'll be using the car next Friday".She said that she would be using the car the next Friday		
<u>NB</u> : These modal do not change in reported speech; might / could / would / should / ought to.		
You do not need to change the tense if thereporting verd is in the present.
